United Church Emergency Appeal – Pakistan

The United Church of Canada is a member of ACT (a global network of 100 churches and Christian aid agencies that enables global responses to emergencies).

As a result of donations made by its members, the United Church sent \$25,000 to ACT immediately following initial news of the crisis, and has now sent an additional \$40,000. ACT members in Pakistan are working diligently to deliver assistance including food, water, tents, kitchen kits, hygiene kits, mosquito nets, and emergency medical care.

The United Church has also contributed \$75,000 through the Canadian Foodgrains Bank (CFGB). The funds will be used for a CFGB member-supported project providing kits containing rice, lentils, flour, oil, sugar, salt, tea, and spices.

Donations may be made to this appeal by putting cash or cheque in an envelope marked "Pakistan Appeal" and including your name or your envelope number. Your donation will be sent to the Appeal (matched by government funds until Oct. 3rd) and you will be credited with the amount.
